This fully guided trip will be based out of Moscow, Idaho where guests may stay at the University Inn Best Western before and after the trip. The price includes roundtrip van transportation between the hotel and the river put-in and take-out sites and all meals from lunch on August 9 through lunch on August 13. Washington Water Trust's Executive Director Susan Adams, will join us on this very special Idaho river trip.

Washington Water Trust improves and protects stream flows and water quality throughout Washington by using innovative, market-based transactions and collaborative partnerships to create balanced solutions.

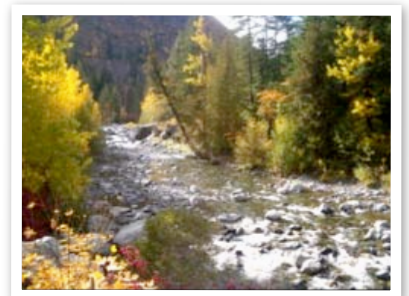
