The Salmon River is the longest free-flowing river in the Pacific Northwest and offers a great raft or dory trip for first-time campers, families and seasoned river runners! The 6,000 foot deep canyon is a place of solitude and beauty with pristine white sand beaches and warm, clear water ideal for swimming! Our trip will be based out of Moscow, Idaho where guests may stay at the University Inn Best Western before and after the trip. *The price includes roundtrip van transportation between the hotel and the river plus all meals from lunch on July 30 through lunch on August 3.*
